Thank you to all parents/carers who attended the school's annual Phonics Workshop. It was very well attended and your feedback was lovely. Many parents commented that they hadn't realised there was so much to teaching phonics to their children and thought the information and apps discussed will be extremely useful at home. The phonics and reading support given to all children at home is extremely important to

their continued progress and is highly valued by class teachers. Children's Reading Diaries / Journals are checked regularly – we strongly urge all parents to support their child/ren at least 5 times per week and record this appropriately. Thank you.

PROMPT START TO THE DAY.

Please can we remind you that the school day starts at 8.55am. You are welcome inside school and in the classrooms from 8.45am for morning reading. The school gates open at 8.40am. Please could you ensure that your child is in class and ready to start their school day by 8.55am and exit through the eternal doors – not the main entrance please. If your child arrives in school after 8.55am then they will need to enter school through the main entrance and are considered late. Lateness is monitored by the school office and attendance is monitored by Miss Dixey. Letters are sent to parents as required. If you have any issues that are causing lateness to school, then please speak to Miss Dixey so that we may support you. Thank you.

GOVERNOR CORNER

SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT 2016-17

Staff, Governors and children continue to work on identified school priorities for this year – we continue to strive for Outstanding . The school has been on a journey for the last six years. In May 2010 the school was graded Satisfactory and in October 2012 we were graded Good by Ofsted at

Miss Dixey's first inspection at Etwall Primary. This was a great improvement but the improvement journey has continued year on year. During this time the criteria by which schools are inspected by Ofsted have changed at least twice and this has meant a shift in the Outstanding "goal posts". The schools improvement priorities this year are:



- To improve pupil outcomes in writing in EYFS, KS1 and KS2 through the introduction of the Talk for Writing approach to cross curricular writing across the school.
- To implement the mastery maths approach across school in order to provide outstanding teaching, learning and assessment for all pupils.
- To streamline school rewards and sanctions strategies, allowing pupils to take responsibility
 for their own behaviour and development. This will include a review of the school's mission
 statement and aims and the introduction of STARFISH (watch this space!)
- To ensure that Governors have a deep, accurate understanding of the school's effectiveness to enable them to challenge and support school improvement.

Please look out for updates in newsletters and chat to staff and Governors as the year progresses.

TOYOTA VISIT



Last week 30 Year 5 and 6 children had the opportunity to visit Toyota's manufacturing plant in Burnaston. They participated in the Art of Manufacturing programme which aims to introduce

children to how Toyota produce motor cars. The children had a great time and were given lots of different tasks to do, from creating a production line to produce lego cars – ensuring that processes were improved upon each time – to working on their manual

dexterity by screwing nuts onto bolt 'blind'. One of the activities they enjoyed most was generating electricity by turning a wheel as many times as they could in a minute. The children all thoroughly enjoyed their time at Toyota and were a credit to the school. SAFEGUARDING: KEEPING SCHOOL UP-TO-DATE

Please could we remind parents of the importance of keeping the school up-to-date with key information as this has caused us some issues already this term in a range of circumstances:

- If your child attends an after school club it is vital that you inform the school directly if your child is not attending the club as normal. This should be done in the morning when you drop off your child directly to the class teacher or during the school day directly to the school office. This information will then be passed on to the school adult in charge of the club who is responsible for ensuring that all children are present at the beginning of the club when the register is called. This is to ensure that your child is safe.
- **Contact information** must be kept up-to-date at the school office so that we can easily contact you should we need to.
- After school arrangements eg tea at a friend's please inform class teachers when you drop off your child so any changes can be noted in good time. This means that class teachers do not have to contact you to query changes at the end of the day.
- Changes to home time contact details or collection arrangements again, please keep your home time arrangements form up to date at the school office. We will not allow your child to





leave school with anyone who is not on the list you have provided us with. Please inform us directly of any changes – these will be amended on your form.

 Please could we also remind you that you are not allowed to take any child, other than your own, without their parent notifying school directly of this arrangement.
