FIRE SAFETY



The Year 1 and 2 classes – Kingfishers and Little Owls have been studying The Great Fire of London this half term. As part of our ongoing work into citizenship and British Values, we have broadened this out to also look into the work of our emergency services. To help out with this, the local fire brigade came in to talk to the children about fire safety and the importance of staying fire safe both at home and in school. The children listened well and are now fully briefed in fire safety! They taught us all about what we should do in the event of a fire and lots of top tips about how we can make

sure our homes our fire-safe. Children learnt the STOP DROP and ROLL technique and even had a go at practising it in the classroom! Kingfisher and Little Owls children were also sent home with a checklist to see if their homes were fire-safe.

THE EYES HAVE IT

The Year 5 and 6 classes recently had a science enrichment visit from Mrs Thompson, friend of the school, who is an eye expert. She came to teach the children about how our eyes work, how we see things and how to look after the health of our eyes. It was a fascinating lesson and the children learnt so much. They especially enjoyed looking at the optical illusions and experimenting with peripheral vision and how our eyes work together to help us to see things. This has provided a great introduction to the topic and the children can't wait to learn more about light in the coming weeks. We would like to thank Mrs Thompson for such an enriching lesson!



SAFEGUARDING : ONLINE SAFETY

Miss Marriott has recently joined the Safeguarding team as part of her role as Online Safety Officer.

She will continue to raise the profile of Online Safety with pupils, staff and the wider community. The NSPCC's Speak out. Stay safe. programme is visiting our school to make sure our pupils have the knowledge and understanding they need to stay safe from abuse.

I'm pleased to tell you that we will be working with the NSPCC, the UK's leading children's charity, who'll be delivering their **Speak out. Stay safe.** programme on **Thursday November 2nd 2017**. This is a nationwide programme for every primary-school-aged child in the UK and Channel Islands. With the help of their friendly mascot Buddy, they'll be presenting an assembly to the KS1 and then KS2 children in our school as well as running a workshop for all Years 5 and 6. School staff will be running sessions on the Underwear Rule – PANTS on this day for all KS1 children.

What is the **Speak out. Stay safe.** programme?

Through child-friendly, interactive assemblies and workshops their specially trained staff and volunteers will give our children information about how to keep themselves safe from harm and how to get help if they have any worries, sensitively discussing issues like bullying and sexual abuse, without using scary words or adult language. We have studied the content of the materials and heard from other schools who have participated and are extremely confident that they are appropriate for primary-school-aged children. By the end of their visit, we're convinced children will feel empowered – knowing how they can speak out and stay safe.

Talking about the Underwear Rule with your children

The NSPCC's work in schools will help encourage conversations about staying safe – and they have a number of child-friendly materials to help you carry on the conversation afterwards. That includes 'The Underwear Rule', a simple way for parents to help keep children safe from sexual abuse – without using scary words or even mentioning sex.



The guide uses the rules of PANTS to teach children that their body belongs to them and them alone. You can find out more and download the free resources at nspcc.org.uk/pants

CROSS COUNTRY

All of the children seemed to enjoy the event, although they were very tired once they reached the finish line. The children in years 3 and 4 came second in the event and the children in year 5 came third. Well done to all of the children who took part and our thanks to all parents who helped transport the children to this event.



MINDFULNESS ATTENTION PROGRAMME (YEAR 5/6)

Our school has been chosen to take part in an exciting new project, which aims to introduce children to mindfulness. Mindfulness involves paying more attention to what is happening right now, with an attitude of curiosity and kindness. By teaching our children to focus a little more on what is happening now and how we are feeling, they can learn to manage day to day difficulties and enjoy themselves more. Children are taught by their own class teacher, who has been trained to deliver the programme. The programme

consists of nine sessions that are fun and designed to support children in developing skills that enable them to enable them to pay attention more effectively, cope with day-to-day stresses and get on better with each other. The children have completed 3 sessions, the response so far is positive and children are beginning to see the benefits.

SCHOOLS FUNDING CRISIS:

You may have seen a number of stories in the press around school funding in recent months. There have been worrying headlines and we felt it important that we let you know, as far as we are able at this stage, how this will affect our school. Newsletters last year alerted you to this crisis and some of the decisions that we have had to make at Etwall.

School budgets across the country have been under pressure for some time. The senior leadership team and Governors at Etwall Primary has been grappling with the funding challenges, leading to a number of tough decisions being made.

Our school is not alone. The National Association of Head Teachers (NAHT) has shown that seven out of ten school leaders think that their budgets will be unsustainable by the 2019 academic year. In July, the Department for Education re-allocated £1.3 billion for schools from existing budgets, **but this is over two years and is not sufficient. Nationally, there is a £2bn gap in funding each year until 2022.** It's clear that the Treasury must now provide additional resources to resolve the funding crisis.

We will work hard to ensure that cuts have the least impact on teaching possible. However, rising costs and a frozen budget mean that tough decisions will have to be taken. We cannot guarantee that such cuts will not impact on teaching, despite doing our utmost to prevent this.





Please be assured that we will take the utmost care with budgets, to ensure all the money we have is spent effectively on your children. We promise to keep you well informed as the year progresses about the school's situation and whether funding will have a significant effect on staffing or activities. The schools Senior Leadership and school governors continue to monitor the school budget and plan ahead.

Schools now have to pay an increased amount of NI and pension contributions and also a new apprentice levy which will not help schools and stretch resources even further. At the same time it is scrapping the £600 million Education Services Grant meaning schools will have to fund additional services for children which are currently being provided by local councils. The real term cuts in school funding is having serious impact on the education of this generation of children. Investing in education is investing in the future and should not be seen as a burden on public spending.

Pupils are encouraged to be **Travel Smart Heroes** and play their part in getting active and help beat the chaos caused by traffic, as well as doing their bit to save the planet in a superhero themed week.

Pupils will be encouraged to be Super Striders and walk to school for all or part of the journey, or to join the Wonder Wheelers travelling by bicycle or scooter. Those who can't stride or roll to school can join Team Riders and travel to school by car share or by taking the bus.

We encourage the children to exercise on the way to school whenever possible. Many children scoot to school - KS1 children should be accompanied by an adult. (Unfortunately, unsupervised scooting can make some members of the public feel a little vulnerable on the pavement.) KS2 children, who come to school on their own, can only use their scooters if parents are happy to take responsibility for "training" their child to travel safely to school with due regard for other footway users. **All children must wear a helmet (as they would on a bike) when using their scooters to travel to and from school.** We do have scooter pods available for the children to use in school. Please ensure that they are put away safely and that children collect them to take home each day after school. It's just a different and fun way to head to school and one which many children are enjoying.
