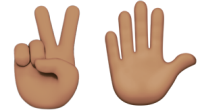

Key language ideas and grammar

- 1** When translating a Latin sentence, first find and translate the **verb**. It's usually (but not always) at the end of a Latin sentence. The verb will tell you who is doing the action and how many people are doing it, as well as what the action is. That's a lot of information!
- 2** Next, find and translate any noun that's a **subject**. If you can't find one, use the pronoun shown by the end of the verb.
- 3** Then, find and translate any noun that's an **object**. There may not be one.
- 4** Finally, translate **any words left** (e.g. adverbs) and add them into your sentence.

Important terms

subject

The noun doing the action in a sentence

object

The noun receiving the action in a sentence

verb

A doing or being word

adverb

A word that describes a verb
